It is a contradiction, however, to advocate the cause of universal justice while still supporting the Zionist project of conquest. This is an untenable position that must be ideologically and politically combated because it weakens both the overall struggles of the left and the struggle against Zionism. To me, you cannot be on the left, in a meaningful sense, and still support the state of Israel-it is like saying that you can be left-wing and still support U.S. imperialism.” *Briarpatch Magazine, August 2007*

Since 1988 he has been Professor of Social Studies at Bard College, Annandale, NY. He is also editor-in-chief of the journal **Capitalism Nature Socialism** (<http://www.cnsjournal.org/>). Kovel has developed his distinctive approach, which draws on both psychoanalysis and Marxism, across a wide range of publications.
